Message from Board Chair and CEO

YMCA Northumberland is committed to building strong, healthy and engaged communities throughout Northumberland County. We believe that everyone deserves access to opportunities to gain confidence, improve health and build relationships. Impacting positive change on the issues that face our communities requires constant and focused effort and action. Through innovative programming, development of strong and effective partnerships, and ongoing investment, YMCA Northumberland is reducing barriers to participation and increasing access to programs and services that make our communities healthier places to live.

Health for every stage

YMCA programs are designed to mirror the needs of the communities we serve. Through ongoing community dialogue with individuals, organizations and user groups in the communities, YMCA Northumberland is continuously developing and adapting relevant programs focused on addressing issues such as social isolation, poverty and chronic disease.

Recognizing the success of the Mothers of Newborns program in 2017, and driven by the valuable impacts described by participants, the program continued for a second year in 2018. Over 240 mothers and their new babies from Northumberland County participated in the program, building positive relationships and experiencing positive impacts on their mental and physical health.

Our growing Child Care Program continues to evolve to include two valuable programs. Our focus on the YMCA Playing to Learn™ curriculum for early learning, based on research and evidence shows play is the most effective way that children learn and gain new skills. The second program, A Place to Connect™, allows children registered in before and after school care to shape the program by providing opportunities for choice and leadership with a focus on strengths and the development of skills and relationships.

For the health and wellness of our Seniors, The Seniors Get Up and Go Program helped keep local participants engaged and active. The program removed barriers to a healthy lifestyle, helping seniors get out of the house and make connections.

Commitment to Quality

We are proud to have achieved prestigious accreditation from Imagine Canada's Standards Program in October 2018. The Standards Program awards accreditation to charities and nonprofits that demonstrate compliance in five fundamental areas: board governance; financial accountability and transparency; fundraising; staff management; and volunteer involvement.

In 2018, YMCA Northumberland Day Camp celebrated 30 years as an Ontario Camps Association accredited camp, helping kids achieve goals, build self-esteem, meet new friends and have fun outdoors. This camp accreditation gives parents the peace of mind that a rigorous set of standards ensuring safety and quality programming will be upheld. In addition, the safety of children in our care is a priority of the YMCA; there is continual annual investment in our YMCA Child Safety and Protection Plan.

Through program satisfaction surveys administered in our Health Fitness and Aquatics Centres, our Child Care Programs and Summer Day Camp Programs, our YMCA ranked above the national average; a testament to the dedication and quality of services provided by our staff and volunteers.

Our Evolving Partnerships

2018 marked new and renewed partnerships for YMCA Northumberland. The 18th year of our partnership with YMCA Nicaragua continued our commitment to global initiatives and supporting a youth centre in the capital, Managua, that offers programs that help strengthen youth, reduce gender violence, and encouraging self-sustainability. In addition, we celebrated 30 years of the YMCA Peace Medal in Northumberland County.

We celebrated the 15th year of operation at the Brighton YMCA satellite location and negotiated a lease renewal to ensure a continued presence in the community for the next five years. Serving over 927 members and accommodating an additional 1821 visits through the array of programs and services offered to the community has made the Brighton YMCA an important asset, promoting health and wellness. We also signed a five-year contract to deliver EarlyON programming on behalf of Northumberland County through the Mobile Outreach service and in four EarlyON Child and Family Centres.

This past year also saw another successful Operation Red Nose campaign. In partnership with the Cobourg and Port Hope Police Services, we were able to generate \$35,000 towards the YMCA Strong Communities Campaign while contributing to the safety of our communities over the holiday season.

Lastly, we continued to join forces with like-minded organizations with a keen interest in building strong communities through The Community Partners Program. We were able to integrate a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) stream into our Summer Day Camp Programs, provide each camper with a healthy breakfast and lunch, and offer drowning prevention training through Swim to Survive sessions.

Our Investment

In 2018, YMCA Northumberland invested \$278,000 in capital expenditures to ensure that programs, facilities and services meet the needs of our communities throughout Northumberland County. Significant upgrades were made to the Cobourg YMCA, including lobby and hallway floor replacement, exterior LED Lighting upgrades, and the addition of new fitness equipment in the personal conditioning centre. These improvements enhanced safety and accessibility for our members. In addition, a complete kitchen renovation has allowed our YMCA Child Care Dietary Manager to continue to deliver quality, nutritious meals to our full-time child care centres and summer camp programs with increased ease and efficiency.

Our Impact

We have become stronger through the support of those who stand behind our mission and unite to build healthy communities; dedicated people, welcoming places and relevant programs allow us to make our communities stronger.

With 2 membership centres, 18 childcare locations, 4 EarlyON centres, an EarlyON Mobile Outreach Service, 3 outdoor pools, Victoria Beach and 3 Day Camp locations, the YMCA reaches every corner of Northumberland County.

In 2018:

- 604 YMCA staff and volunteers worked together to extend the YMCA's reach
- 98 youth were employed by YMCA Northumberland, providing opportunities to gain valuable employment skills and experience
- 6,477 people from across the County participated in YMCA programs and services where they improved their health and wellness through inclusive, effective programming
- 1,003 children were registered in licensed child care throughout Northumberland County where they grew and developed through our play-based learning curriculum
- 506 children and youth developed leadership and problem-solving skills at our 3 summer Day Camp locations
- 3,198 children participated in YMCA swim lessons and 702 grade three students participated in the Swim to Survive, Lifesaving Society program
- 252 mothers from Northumberland County, participated in the Mothers of Newborns Program gaining a support network for their growing family
- 1,682 adults over 55 years of age engaged in membership in Cobourg and Brighton, many of these were retirees on fixed incomes
- 229 seniors got active through participation in the Seniors Get Up and Go program
- Over 9 nights of Operation Red Nose, 200 volunteers drove over 9,045 kilometres to provide 277 safe rides home
- 423 YMCA volunteers gave 12,023 hours to help us build strong kids, strong families, and strong communities

In closing, we encourage you to read through our 2018 Annual Report to learn about some of the YMCA members who have taken positive strides to change their lives and create positive impacts across Northumberland County. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to you for your support of YMCA Northumberland. Whether you are a YMCA member, volunteer, staff, donor, partner, or ally, your participation at YMCA Northumberland allows us to remain relevant in our communities. Together with our partners, we remain dedicated to building healthy, engaged children, youth, adults, families and communities.

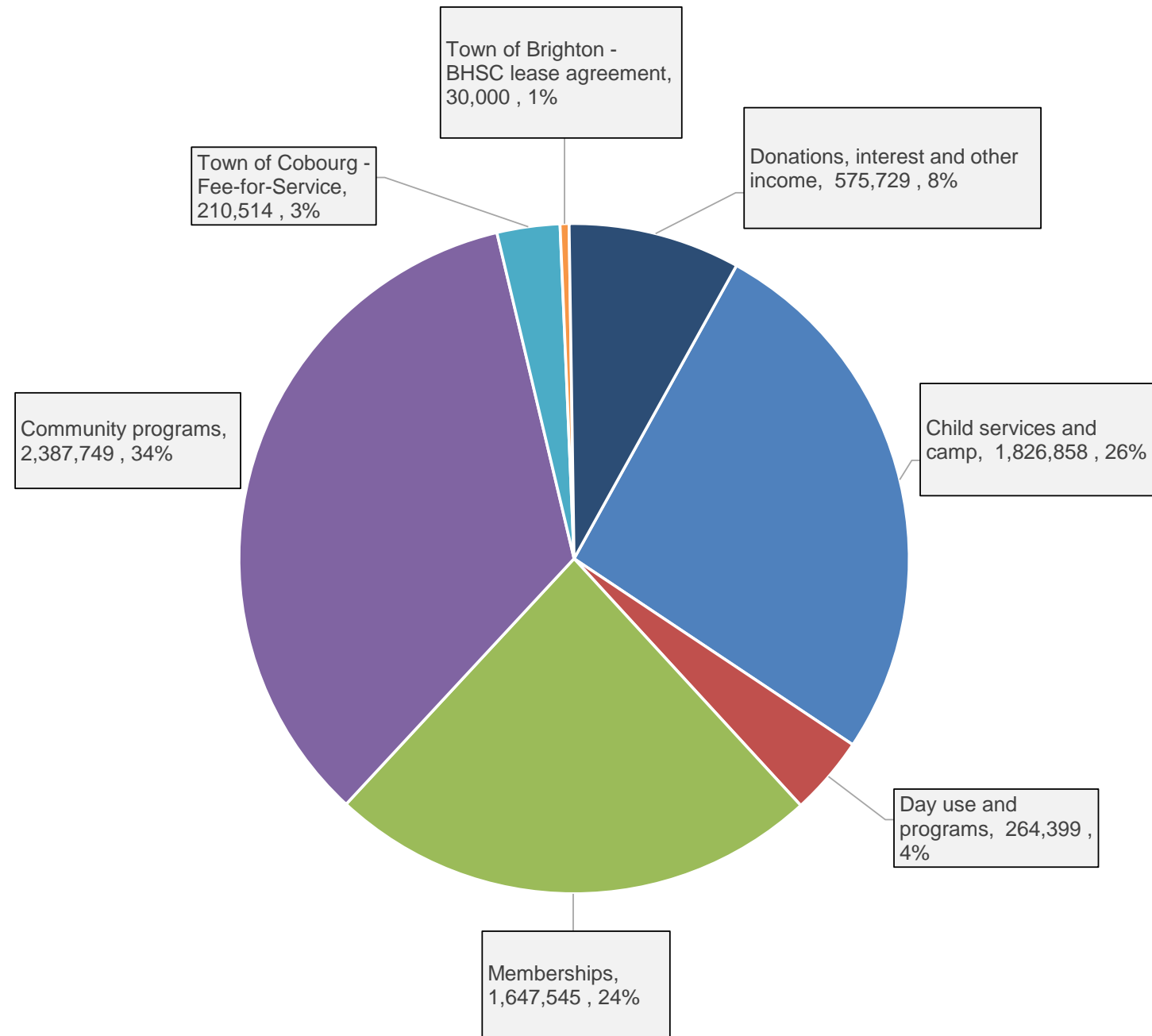

Maddie



Morley and Jack

“I wouldn’t be the person in that Facebook post if it wasn’t for the YMCA.”

This was Maddie’s response to a recent social media post commending her for her quick response to provide first aid to someone in need. Modest and unassuming, Maddie is always quick to point out that any response is a team effort, and to highlight the roles played by others. In her role as Team Lead, Aquatics, her skills and abilities are evident in her interactions, and she inspires confidence in those around her in a seemingly effortless manner.

Maddie has worked hard to develop the confidence we see today. As a young child, the YMCA was a second home to Maddie and her family. Maddie was very shy and recalls feeling out of her comfort zone when participating in swim lessons as group social settings were a source of anxiety and stress for her. From the side of the YMCA pool deck, Maddie would watch the lifeguards and swim instructors, and dream of becoming one of them someday. She admired their confidence, camaraderie and skill, and the way they were able to engage and educate children. When an instructor

approached Maddie and encouraged her to stick with her swim lessons and continue to complete her leadership courses, Maddie was inspired and flattered that the instructor believed in her abilities. She worked through each level, one at a time, overcoming challenges and setbacks along the way. At times, the anxiety she felt about evaluations or exams got in the way of her success, but Maddie did not give in. She worked hard to develop strategies to help her succeed, and empowered by knowing people believed in her, achieved her goal of becoming a lifeguard. Since then, Maddie has continued to learn and grow, achieving her certifications to instruct leadership level courses and to train new lifeguards and swim instructors.

When asked what makes her love teaching courses so much, Maddie describes the excitement she feels when a skill “clicks” for one of her students, and she is thrilled to witness the pride and sense of accomplishment her students feel when they successfully complete a certification. She believes YMCA courses are unique because the goal is to provide the support

and assistance students need to get them to successful completion, regardless of the path taken or the amount of time it takes. Her understanding of the unique needs of learners in her classes creates a safe and productive environment for them to master the skills and requirements of certification.

As a member of the Funds Development Committee, Maddie actively contributes to the charitable mission of the YMCA. She is the Youth Representative for YMCA Northumberland and represented our YMCA at the National AGM and Youth Summit last year. In both these roles, Maddie uses the skills she has developed through participation in YMCA aquatics and leadership courses to advance the YMCA mission and values. She describes the YMCA as “a feeling” and her unwavering commitment to ensuring children and youth have the opportunity to learn and grow makes our YMCA and our community stronger.

Meet Morley and Jack

According to Jack, this is “the best summer ever!” This is Jack’s second summer working as a YMCA Summer Day Camp Counsellor, and this year, Jack has had the opportunity to provide one on one support to Morley. Each day, Jack and Morley spend the day together in our camp program, participating with a group of other campers Morley’s age. Jack helps Morely out, and supports his needs throughout the day, but Jack will be the first to tell you, Morley helps him out too!

“Morely has taught me a lot”, Jack says. “We work hard to make sure we are communicating clearly. Morley will let me know if I did not get it right, and we will keep working until he is sure I completely understood him. I am learning from Morley’s patience and perseverance.” Jack has gotten to know Morley, and takes the time to learn about and share in Morley’s interests, such as favourite movies and music.

Morley has been in YMCA Day Camp for 4 years and has become an important part of our camp community. Quick with a smile and full of jokes, Morley is known for his

love of archery, Elton John, exploring in the forest, and his incredible dance moves. When asked what he loves best about camp, Morely says “being Robin Hood at archery, swinging like an ape in the trees in the forest and being with his friends” are the best parts. He loves to make others laugh, and his sense of humour is greatly appreciated by other campers in his group.

Morley’s family believes that camp has provided him with the opportunity to build friendships with other kids his age and to be part of a group. At camp he has learned about himself, taken on new challenges in an environment where he feels and supported, and been able to try new activities like archery and low ropes. Morley says that Jack helps him every day with things like reminding him to put on sunscreen to playing his favourite games with him.

Morley’s Mom was ecstatic to learn that Morley could attend camp this summer, and confident that he would receive the support he needs from Jack to have a successful summer. “It wasn’t about me - it was about him and his well-being. After more than

three months of social isolation, my son had quarantine fatigue - he was upset about not being able to see his friends or engage in activities”, says Morley’s Mom. “For Morley, being able to go to camp changes all of this and gives him the chance to just be a kid and reconnect socially.”

Camp is a place where everyone is welcome, and each person is recognized for their individual strengths and attributes. Morley’s peers welcome him each day, and appreciate his unique perspectives and talents.

Our community is stronger because of relationships like Jack and Morley’s.

For Luke’s Mom and Dad, YMCA emergency Child Care made it possible for them to continue their important work as essential workers when most of the province was shut down.

At 12 months old, it was time for Luke to go to childcare so his Mom could return to work providing important and essential service to our community. As first-time parents, Luke’s parents had not used childcare before, and felt anxious about finding a Child Care program that would meet their needs as shift workers. With no family locally who could provide care, they needed to find a spot for Luke.

When they learned that the YMCA was offering Emergency Child Care for essential workers, they were thrilled. According to Luke’s Mom, right from the very first interaction, the YMCA staff made the experience comfortable and easy. Her questions were answered, and she felt that the unique needs of her family were able to be met.

Although dropping Luke off to Child Care for the first time was hard to do, Luke’s Mom says the staff did everything they could to make it as easy and stress free as possible. She appreciates being met with a smile every morning and feels confident that her son is being cared for in a safe and supportive environment. The use of the Wee Markable app, a tool that allows parents to receive updates and information about their child’s daily experiences at Child Care made it a bit easier to be away from Luke during the day.

It is important to Luke’s parents that he gets to know and trust other adults, and that he has the chance to socialize with children close to his age. They have been astounded at the development they saw in Luke after just one month of care, and credit a budding sense of curiosity to the enriching Playing to Learn curriculum he participates in at YMCA Child Care. They value the socialization opportunities the program offers, and feel that the skills Luke is building will assist greatly when it is time to transition to school.

When picking Luke up from Child Care one day, a YMCA Educator let Mom know that she “loved the way Luke dances when we sing to him!” This statement meant a lot to Luke’s Mom, as it demonstrated the way the Educators were getting to know Luke as an individual, and how in tune they were with her son’s needs and preferences.

Luke’s family has been very appreciative that the YMCA was able to offer Emergency Child Care in response to community needs.

Our community is stronger because of YMCA programs and services that meet the changing needs of our communities.

As a retired nurse with a long career in long term care, Carol knows firsthand how important it is for seniors to stay active and healthy.

When Carol was training to be a nurse, her learning was hands-on. She learned skills and science, but above all, she believes the ability to demonstrate compassion was her most important asset. She demonstrated care for each patient as an individual and promoted finding out what was important to each person.

After living in Toronto, on the East coast and in Hamilton, Carol has now called Northumberland County home for many years. After her retirement, she suffered a few consecutive injuries, which led to the discovery that she had osteoporosis. She knew she needed to do something to slow the disease and build up her strength, so she joined the YMCA. Since joining, Carol has become a regular, attending aquafit classes five times a week. She feels stronger and healthier and knows her participation has contributed to many fracture free years.

Carol knows that physical health is only one dimension of health. She feels that the warm welcome she receives from fellow participants in the aquafit program, instructors and staff are a great way to start her day. “It warms my heart to come to the YMCA”, Carol says. She places a lot of importance on the social side of participation and knows the benefits of having a little fun.

Carol has been a supporter of the YMCA Strong Communities Campaign for several years. When asked what makes her choose the YMCA as the charity she supports, Carol recalls a discussion with a YMCA staff who explained to her how much contributions to the campaign help people in our communities.

Carol was particularly moved to hear about children who would not have the opportunity to participate in camp without help with the fees. She was surprised to hear that this was a reality in Northumberland County, where poverty is not always as obvious as in larger cities. She believes the YMCA is “a great thing for a community to have”
