Nomination Guidelines

- YMCA staff members are not eligible for nomination.
- Professionals who are paid to do peacemaking work are not eligible for nomination.
- Self-nominations will not be considered.
- Impact can be local, national or international.
- Individuals or group must either reside in Northumberland County or complete work that impacts Northumberland County.
