MESSAGE FROM BOARD CHAIR AND CEO

Building A Brighter Tomorrow - Impact 2024

As we close another remarkable year, we reflect on all that we've accomplished together in 2024. It's been a year of milestones, growth, and unstoppable commitment to our communities. We have so much to be proud of.

Our achievements span every corner of the organization, and none of it would have been possible without our incredible staff, volunteers, community partners, and donors. Your energy and spirit drive our mission forward, and we're honoured to work alongside you.

Expanding Our Reach

We've grown our Health, Fitness, and Aquatics footprint significantly. The Campbellford site opened in November, now serving 2,300+ people. In Brighton, our lease renewal through 2031 supports future planning, with membership at an all-time high of 600. Cobourg also hit a record 4,350 members, thanks to our dedicated teams.

Listening to Our Members

In our 2024 Member Survey, participation increased with 605 responses. Member Experience rose from 80 to 83, and our Net Promoter Score jumped by 21 points. Staff were recognized with scores of 92 for friendliness, 93 for inclusivity, and 87 for overall appreciation showcasing the supportive environment we've built.

Strategic Partnerships and Growth

We signed a new agreement with the Town of Cobourg to explore expanded recreation services near the Cobourg Community Centre. Our community programs of UpTurn and Mothers of Newborns launched in Campbellford, and the Alternative Suspension Program was renewed with both school boards. Events like the Rainbow Run, Peace Breakfast, and Operation Red Nose continue to foster engagement and connection.

Supporting Children and Families

Responding to the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care system, we opened 62 new licensed spaces in Warkworth and Cobourg East. Our 25 childcare sites continue to thrive, thanks to our phenomenal staff navigating sector challenges. EarlyON exceeded expectations with outstanding outreach and programming.

Behind the Scenes

Much of our progress was powered by the essential work behind the scenes. Our teams launched the *Shine ON* Campaign, completed a major bank transition, welcomed a new audit firm, submitted our reaccreditation with Imagine Canada, and ensured compliance with the updated Ontario Non-For-Profit Act legislation. We also continue to maintain high standards in child protection through annual audits.

Through every challenge and success, our vision has remained clear. Together, we shine brighter.

Thank you for your continued trust and belief in what we can achieve by working together. Here's to another exciting year ahead.

On behalf of YMCA Canada and YMCA Northumberland, we are thrilled to see Lynda recognized with this honourable medal for her lifelong commitment to making Northumberland a stronger and brighter place to work and live.

ROYCE'S STORYA Birthday Cake & A Bucket List!



At 90 years young, Royce McCracken is redefining what it means to age. Far from slowing down, Royce continues to live with vitality, passion, and a youthful spirit—much of which he credits to the support and community of YMCA Northumberland.

Born in 1935, Royce's life journey has been shaped by resilience, from humble beginnings during the Great Depression to having a successful career in administration and entrepreneurship.

He also loved projects and building things, so much so that he successfully built his home, cottage and several motorhomes too.

After retiring, he and his wife embraced adventure, travelling North America in a modified Dodge Caravan as self-proclaimed "ski-bums." Even in his 80s, he entered skiing expos and skied full runs non-stop, refusing to let age put boundaries on his passions.

But it wasn't until his 70s that Royce truly embraced structured physical fitness—first at the Campbellford gym, and then, since 2011, at the Cobourg YMCA. Within this space, he found more than just a place to work out; he found a second home.

"The Y has given me strength, social connection, and a purpose," says Royce. "The instructors, the classes, the people—they keep me coming back. Staying active keeps depression at bay and helps me live independently."

Royce's commitment to the Y culminated in a self-imposed "bucket list" for his 90th birthday of 12 specific exercises, including an impressive 3 minute wall sit. His efforts are proof not only of his determination but of the transformative power of community and movement.

"Being 90 doesn't make me feel old," he says. "I still live alone, cook, clean, and keep moving. As long as I'm able, I'll refuse to live or act my age."

Royce's story is proof that with the right mindset—and a supportive community like the YMCA—longevity isn't just about adding years to life, but life to years and enriching lives - one family at a time.

"Socializing at the Y has introduced me to many wonderful people, all of us here for a common reason."





Mary Ross's journey with the YMCA began in February 2004 when she joined with her mother, drawn to the energy and fun of group fitness classes. She quickly became a regular, attending five days a week and embracing the routine that kept her active and connected.

That summer, an opportunity arose at the Brighton Y's front desk, and Mary applied. She was hired in September 2004, embarking on what would become a 21-year career dedicated to the YMCA and its members.

Mary's involvement with the Y has grown tremendously over the years. Just months into her role at the front desk, she took on a new challenge. When a need arose for fitness instructors, she stepped up, transitioning from a devoted participant to a leader. With a mix of formal training and hands-on learning, she quickly adapted. That willingness to grow and change has been a hallmark of her time with the Y. Today, Mary proudly serves as the Brighton Membership Coordinator.

Beyond fitness, Mary credits the YMCA with shaping her into the person she is today.

Naturally introverted before joining, she now is outgoing and comfortable in social settings.

The relationships she built with members and colleagues are a daily source of joy.

MARY'S STORY

"The people keep me here. You can walk in feeling off, but between the endorphins and the connections, you walk out with a smile on your face!"

Her deep sense of community was never more evident than during COVID-19. Tasked with calling members about updates, she found herself having lengthy conversations with people who were isolated and longing for connection. "It took forever because everyone wanted to talk," she says. "People were lonely. Even a phone call meant the world to them."

Mary has also experienced firsthand the support and love the YMCA fosters. In 2023, she took a medical leave to undergo heart surgery. What surprised her most was the overwhelming outpouring of support from both staff and members. "You don't realize how important your work is until something like this happens," she says. "It took three cards just to fit everyone's messages. I felt honoured and lucky to be part of this big Y family."

The Brighton Y is more than a fitness centre to Mary; it's a place of inclusion, growth & resilience that is key to the community. She passionately advocates for its importance and encourages anyone considering the Y to jump in wholeheartedly.

"It's a big happy family. You just keep going forward."

LINDSEY'S STORY

For this local family, the opening of the Warkworth YMCA Child Care Centre and the Campbellford YMCA has made a meaningful difference in their daily lives. With the new child care centre just five minutes from home, Lindsey Dewdney saves both time and money—cutting nearly an hour of daily travel and significantly reducing gas expenses. Plus, she loves knowing that the friends her child is making will continue with her as she grows.

"It allows our daughter to make connections right in our local community and develop relationships that will follow her to Percy Centennial and beyond."

The nearby YMCA in Campbellford has also brought health and wellness closer to home. As a family, they enjoy swimming together, and their daughter is now enrolled in lessons just 12 minutes away—no more long trips to Cobourg. They really enjoy how convenient it is to prioritize being active together.

"We are able to go early in the morning or throughout the day for a quick workout, class or swim, " Lindsey adds. "It has allowed us to be healthier for ourselves and our family."





MATTEHA'S STORY

As a young mother of two, life was chaotic and isolating for Matteha Liston. With her partner working away as a long-haul truck driver, she spent years parenting solo without access to child care. That all changed in January 2025 when both of her children were enrolled at the new Warkworth YMCA Child Care Centre

"Everything is different now," she says. "I could go back to work and get my husband off the road and home!"

What's more, the YMCA child care staff have made a lasting impact, supporting her children through emotional and developmental growth. She has noticed how they helped her oldest with aggression and language, and her youngest with speaking in sentences and trying new foods.

"Love grows stronger at the Y" has never hit me so hard... my kids started growing SO MUCH within the YMCA; it's like they're different kids!" says Matteha.


